Hop into the new year with a bang!


Tu-gether, We are One!

Every week, the student volunteers will come up with different types of origami for the children to create and explore.

The week of Valentine's Day, children made heart shaped origami and exchanged it with their friends. They also learnt to fold boat shaped crowns and cute puppies that they can take home to show their parents! Being able to learn to fold various origami crafts not only helps them to improve their confidence but it is also an opportunity for them to mingle and make friends with their peers. Exploring Yarn with SUSS!

This March holiday, the children further explored crafts using different colored yarn. The student volunteers from Singapore University of Social Sciences (SUSS) put in much effort to prepare the materials beforehand. They cut out the first letter of each child's name with cardboard, source for various yarn, and super glued the wooden sticks together to make a template for each child to create a turtle yarn.
